What Changes will be seen in NLPS?

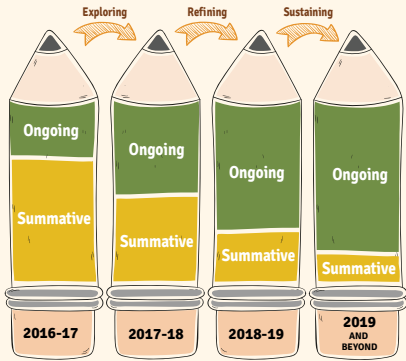
We are moving from a model of Reporting **TO** Parents, to Communicating **WITH** Parents on an ongoing basis. This involves how we assess, and how we communicate student learning to parents and to students.

In NLPS, we are changing our approach to help our learners connect with and acquire the skills they need to succeed.

Communicating Student Learning in NLPS – What will it look like?

Ongoing - is communication about student learning.

Summative - is a written report about student achievement.

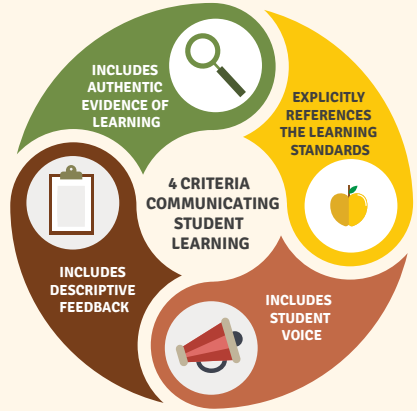


Timeline of Changes

1. Ongoing Communications of Student Learning

Parents of students in grades 8 and 9 can expect timely Ongoing Communications of Student Learning throughout the year, which will meet the following 4 criteria.

These Communications include, but are not limited to: work samples, Celebrations of Success or Electronic Communications/Portfolios.



2. Written Progress Reports:

In grades 8 and 9, parents will receive a Written Progress Report once per curricular area, and a Written

Summative Report at the end of the course. These reports will occur at different times for yearlong and semester courses.

The following *draft* **Competency Scale** will be used to describe your child’s progress in relation to grade level expectations in this year of exploration:

Beginning to acquire knowledge, skills, strategies and processes.	Developing the ability to apply knowledge, skills, strategies and processes.	Applying knowledge, skills, strategies and processes consistently.	Extending knowledge, skills, strategies and processes creatively and strategically.
